

On November 21st, 1883 the Great Lakes Steamer called the "Erie Belle" made her last voyage.

You can access this beach at the base of Boiler Beach Road where it intersects with Concession 12, or where it intersects with Huronville Street (just south of Kincardine).



Lucknow at 589 Campbell Street

The Lucknow mural is on the east side of Everlastings Flowers and Gifts. In this mural, you will find:

- a mandala for Lucknow's name sake
- a hockey stick and medal to represent our successful
- wheat for the area farmers and Lucknow logo
- music notes, a quitar, a music scale and field to represent Music in the Fields
- strawberries for the annual Strawberry Summerfest
- a tartan, pole and rock represent the Caledonia games
- various flowers to represent community organizations and all the work they do

Ripley at 46 Queen Street

In this mural, you will find:

- wheel hub representing "The Hub of Huron"
- ferris wheel, maple leaf, crown and tent for the Ripley
- mix of vegetables and flowers for the Bruce Botanical Food Gardens
- curling rock, skate, and wolf for sports and the Ripley Wolves

- roses and flowers for the community organizations
- a tartan, Scottish man and sign with 1852 on it for the Lewis Settlers
- apples and tree branches for the Ripley Rail Trail (old railway line) and the Ripley Apple
- the colours blue, yellow and purple to represent the Ripley Lions Club
- · the colour green for the Ripley logo

Point Clark at 529 Lighthouse Road

The Point Clark mural is on the west side of the public washroom building across from the Point Clark Lighthouse. In this mural, you will find:

- the Point Clark Lighthouse
- a seaman's lantern hung in a pine tree (representing the original navigation tool for boaters)
- · an ice cream cone
- fireworks and bonfires
- waves and shipwrecks
- an Adirondack chair
- the colour yellow for the light shining from the Lighthouse
- shades of blue representing the lake
- yellow and blue also represent then Huron Shores

Located at the corner of County Road 1 and Highway 86, this Hilgendorf original celebrates Lucknow's own hockey hero.

We are a Prosperous community that continues to grow in a sustainable

- \$44 million in new building construction in 2022 and 213 building permits issued.
- Natural Gas distribution construction continued in Lucknow, Ripley and along the Lakeshore.
- Awarded over \$1 million dollars in grant funding and donations for economic development projects including the Point Clark Lighthouse, Women in Carpentry and the Hub!
- Record year for the Holiday Shopping Pass, \$166,950 spent in Huron-Kinloss between November 13th and December 24th, 2022. Great support for our local businesses!


We are a Vibrant community that values our uniqueness and creativity.

Lucknow Standpipe

In 2022 our application to replace the Lucknow Standpipe was approved! Construction began in 2022 and will be complete in late 2023.

After more than a decade of planning for the replacement of the Lucknow Standpipe, the Township of Huron-Kinloss was presented with funding from Huron-Bruce M.P.P. Lisa Thompson from the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Green

Throughout the years, the Township prepared for the replacement of the standpipe, investing in the necessary engineering and design work to bring the project to a "shovel ready" state.

The Township even purchased additional property to improve access to and the location of the standpipe, reducing construction and future maintenance costs and eliminating negative impacts on the neighbouring properties. By the end of 2019, almost \$500,000 was invested in this project, without even breaking groud.

MPAC **Property Assessments**

MPAC determines property assessments for all properties in Ontario. Municipalities determine revenue requirements, set municipal tax rates and collect property taxes to pay for municipal services. The Government of Ontario establishes the province's assessment and taxation laws and determines education tax rates.

The Ontario government postponed the 2020 Assessment Update due to the pandemic. Property assessments for 2023 property tax year will continue to be based on the January 1, 2016 current values. This means your property assessment for the 2023 property tax year will be the same as the 2022 tax year, unless there have been changes to your property.

We are continuously reviewing properties. You may have received a Notice for one of the following reasons:

- · change to property ownership, legal description, or school support;
- change to the property's value resulting from a Request for Reconsideration, an Assessment Review Board decision, or ongoing property reviews;
- property value increase/decrease reflecting a change to the property; for example, a new structure, addition, or removal of an old
- change in the classification or tax liability of the property.

Fire Safety

The Fire Departments within the Township of Huron-Kinloss are responsible for the provision of fire and emergency response services, ongoing fire prevention and public education programs.

Fire Permits

Fire permits are issued on an annual basis. Recreational fires are exempt from requiring a permit. The Fire Chief is responsible for administering the Open-Air Burning By-Law and for issuing permits. Fire permits are available for purchase at the Municipal Office. The fee is \$10.00. Once a fire permit is obtained the permit holder will be required to call the hotline at 1-800-511-9911 prior to igniting a fire.

Emergency Management


For personal emergencies, you must know your 911 or civic address, which is a combination of your house number, street name and name of your Municipality. Your house/cottage/store number should be clearly visible from the road.

In the event of a disaster or large-scale emergency, first responders may be busy assisting those in immediate danger. Its important for you to have a 72 Hour Kit which should hold enough supplies to support you and your family for three days in an emergency.

Along with a 72 hour kit, have an emergency action plan. It will ensure that you and your family members know what to do and who to call.

Recycling Programs

Blue Box Recycling

Curbside pick-up is provided on a bi-weekly schedule by BASWR. Blue boxes must be at the curb by 8:00 a.m. on collection day and be visible to the driver.

Blue boxes can be purchased for \$10 each at the Municipal Office or Huron Landfill site.

BASWR accepts:

Corrugated Cardboard

Cardboard bins are located at the Point Clark Community Centre, the Public Works shed at 12 Blake Street in Ripley, the old Fire Hall at the corner of Willoughby Street and Inglis Street in Lucknow, and the Huron Landfill site.

E-Waste & Batteries

You can get rid of electronics and single-use batteries at no charge by bringing them to the Huron Landfill at 2087 Concession 6 East. Electronics are prepared and shipped off site. Don't forget to wipe your drives!

Green Cone Digesters

We offer Green Cone Digesters for sale at the Municipal Office. Green Cones are in-ground digesters that break down ALL food scraps, including meat, bones and dairy. This will not only cut down on the waste that goes to the landfill but also your personal household collection expense. It's a win-win for the environment and for you! Digesters cost \$54.60 + hst.

Mattresses & box springs


For a fee, mattresses and box springs can be taken to the Huron Landfill where they will be prepared for shipping off site.


Farm Plastics Recycling

By-laws and Regulatory Information

Heather Falconer, By-law Enforcement Officer It is the By-Law Enforcement Officer's responsibility to ensure all dogs are licensed within the Township of Huron-Kinloss and to tend to any canine concerns residents may have. It is every dog owner's responsibility to purchase and attach a Township tag to their dog. To report a lost or found dog, contact the By-Law

Enforcement Officer by pager at 519-395-3844.

The By-Law Enforcement Officer may be contacted with any questions or concerns regarding any enforceable by-law; namely bylaws concerning the protection of persons and property. To voice any questions or concerns please contact the By-Law Enforcement Officer at hfalconer@huronkinloss.com.

Township By-Law Q&A

- Q: I am a business owner and would like to advertise my business on a sign, where can I place my sign?
- A: A business sign may be erected at the location of the business. The sign will need to meet size and zoning criteria that can be found in the Sign By-Law No. 2019-140. Signs may also require a building permit. It is important to read the by-law and if you have any questions to contact the Township office.
 - No sign shall be attached to a tree, hydro pole, Township pole or support, or on Township or public property without Township permission.
- Q: Are there regulations to aid with snow removal and alleviate safety concerns during the winter months?
- A: According to the Township of Huron-Kinloss Parking Control By-Law 99-20, parking on the road is not permitted between Nov. 1 and April 30, between the hours of 1:00 and 6:00 a.m., to ensure roadways get cleared of snow properly.

Also, the Prohibition of Snow Piling By-Law 2011-136 prohibits snow or ice from being shoveled onto roadways, which can cause saftey concerns. Fines may be issued if caught in violation of either of the aforementioned offenses.

Q: How does the Noise By-Law pertain to me?

- General noise must be minimized between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. the next day (9:00 a.m. on Sundays). Every homeowner should be mindful of neighbouring residents and properties at all times to not disturb the natural enjoyment of their properties. This includes persistent barking or whining of domestic pets.
 - If you are hosting a celebration or gathering, exemptions to the Noise By-law can be obtained through Council to avoid prosecution. You must apply in writing to council at least 6 weeks in advance of the function. Contact the Clerks department at info@huronkinloss.com for further details.
- Q: When can I have a family fireworks display?
- A: According to our Noise Control By-Law 2005-101, the detonation of fireworks is prohibited in a residential area except in association with Victoria Day and/or Canada Day celebrations. All family members, tenants and renters visiting property in Huron-Kinloss should be made aware of these restrictions.

Township By-Law Q&A Continued

Q: Where may I ride my Off-Road Vehicle in Huron-Kinloss?

A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss Off-Road Vehicle Use By-Law 2015-89 permits Off-Road vehicles to drive on Township roadways if all operators and the vehicles are properly licensed and they follow all regulations under the Highway Traffic Act.

Off-Road vehicles are not permitted in urban areas such as Ripley or Lucknow or in the area West of Lake Range Drive except to obtain food, lodging or fuel. In no circumstances are Off-Road vehicles permitted on the beach or public trails.

Q: My neighbours' yard is a mess. Is there anything the Township can do to have it cleaned up?

A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss has a Property Standards By-Law No. 2018-100, which deals with the exterior and interior of a building and the yards surrounding it. This By-Law is a minimum maintenance by-law, setting out the minimum standards in which a property must be kept. These health and safety guidelines are in place to protect neighbours as well as the property owners.

Q: What is Giant Hogweed and what should I do with it?

A: Giant Hogweed is designated as a noxious weed in accordance with the Weed Control Act RSO 1990 as well as the Township of Huron-Kinloss Property Standards By-Law. It is very hazardous to human health, if the stem oils come in contact with human skin it may cause severe burns. Giant Hogweed must be killed immediately upon knowledge of its growth; if not done so by the property owner the Township will bring the property into compliance at the expense of the owner. If an established growth is found, it is recommended that a contractor be hired to remove the growth.

Q: I have a raccoon/skunk hanging around my property. What can I do to get rid of it?

A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss does not deal with nuisance wildlife. We can provide the names of local trappers and/or private nuisance animal companies that will remove the animal for you at your expense.

Q: Does the Township have any regulations regarding the waterfront and beachfront area?

A: The Township of Huron-Kinloss has entered an agreement with the Ministry of Natural Resources to help protect our lakeshore. Regulations in the agreement can be enforced by our By-Law Enforcement Officer. Regulations are listed below and are posted at many of the beach access points in Huron-Kinloss.

- No littering
- No golfcarts and motorized vehicles permitted on the beach (by permit only, if a permit is required for equipment on the beach please contact mfair@huronkinloss. com)
- Clean up after pets
- No dune destruction or alteration (this includes cutting down vegetation/trees)
- · Burn any substance without a permit
- No igniting fireworks
- No constructing or placing a structure on the beach
- No harming or removing invasive or native vegetation

The Township of Huron-Kinloss By-law Enforcement Officer has been appointed by the Ministry as a Public Lands Act Officer, thus giving authority to monitor beach activity, to educate the public and enforce these regulations using an Off-Road Vehicle.


Q: When am I permitted to water my lawn?


A: Lawn Watering By-Law 2010-46 is in effect from June 1 to Sept. 15 annually. Permitted lawn watering is determined by your house number. Even numbered houses may water on even numbered days and odd numbered houses water on odd days of the month. Watering is permitted between 6:00 and 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 and 9:00 p.m. unless you use an automated sprinkler system, which must be set to run between 4:00 and 7:00 a.m. on the property's respective day. Fines will be issued if caught in violation of the lawn watering By-Law.

Regulations & Requirements

Golf cars are subject to regulations under the Highway Traffic Act.

To operate a Golf Car in Huron-Kinloss you must:

- Have a valid A, B, C, D, E, F or G (full) licence
- Operate on roads with a maximum speed limit of 50 kilometres per hour or less
- Only operate between April 1 and November 30
- Not carry passengers under 8 years old
- Operate in the lane furthest to the right, unless preparing to make a left turn
- Cross at an intersection where there is a traffic control signal, stop sign, and/or other traffic control devices that control traffic in all directions
- Not be capable of 32 km/h or faster on level surface
- Have adequate nighttime lighting during the period that begins one half-hour before sunset and one half-hour after sunrise
- Have daytime running lights that are always on
- · Not tow other vehicles
- Not be used for an Ontario driver's licence road test

Insurance

We recommend you speak with your insurance representative with respect to your coverage (physical and liability) with participation in the pilot project.





Under the Township of Huron-Kinloss Golf Car Pilot Project, Golf Cars are permitted on specified municipal roads and with certain conditions.

The Golf Car can be electric or gas powered and must have:

- 1. Two to Six Seats
- Steering Wheel
- 3. Rear-view Mirror(s)
- Horn
- 5. Good-quality Tires
- Daytime Running Lights
- 7. Turn Signals
- 8. Brake Lights
- 9. Reflectors
- 10. Slow-moving Vehicle Sign on Back

- 11. If there are factory installed Seat Belts they must be used by Driver and all **Passengers**
- 12. Registration Sticker with current Validation Sticker
- 13. Service Brakes and Parking or **Emergency Brake**
